


The child with 100% attendance this week:






Y1's first attempt at using a number line.

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Parent Survey Feedback:

Each week we will be giving a response in the newsletter to one of the questions which was asked in the parent survey before the summer holiday.

'The school lets me know how my child is doing.'

You said...

93% agree that school lets you know how your child is doing, 6% of you disagree with this statement with 1% felt that they do not know.

We will always...

- Early Years parents can see information on Tapestry which allows them to see their child's progress captured in pictures at this young age.
- Y1 to Y6 use 'Seesaw', on which, parents can see how well their child completes any homework given.
- We have an open door policy which enables parents to easily speak with class teachers and members of the senior leadership team at drop off and pick up times. We encourage parents to reach out with any questions or concerns as well as celebrations over their child's progress.
- Members of staff phone parents with important updates, information or concerns over progress.
- There are formal parents' evenings in the autumn and spring terms with an optional one in the summer term after school reports have been distributed. At these parent's evenings, a report card is given to the parents as a guide to how their child is performing in class.
- Annual school reports give detailed information on how well your child is doing.
- Open classrooms each term give parents the chance to look at their child's work.
- We understand that clear communication regarding your child's progress is vital and would welcome any suggests as to how we can.





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Sports News:

This week our children have been busy taking part in more events at The Angmering School: boccia, tag rugby, football and netball. We are always proud of how well our children play and represent our school.



Christmas:

We are aware that many of you choose not to send too many cards for environmental or financial reasons, however, if your child would like to send a Christmas card to a friend in school, the post box will soon be available in the front area near to the first aid room.
