

A letter from Dame Rachel De Souza, Children's Commissioner. Good afternoon,

I am delighted to announce that tomorrow I will be launching 'The Big Ambition' to hear directly from children and young people across the country. I wanted to update you on 'The Big Ambition' survey before it goes live tomorrow on Thursday, September 14th. It is embargoed until 00.01, so please do not share more widely before then.

Now, as we approach the General Election, I am clear that it is a crucial moment to take children and young people's voices to policymakers and the Government, to make sure they are heard.

That is why, through 'The Big Ambition' survey I want to hear from children and young people about their schools, communities, family life, and the wider world. I am also asking what they want for their future, their hopes, dreams, and aspirations.

Schools are absolutely critical for me to be able to hear from as many children and young people as possible. That is why, I would appreciate your support and help in encouraging your school community to complete the survey. Although we have food donations from supermarkets and other suppliers, it is becoming harder for suppliers to spread food donations around the local community. If you are able to donate essential food items for families at school who are struggling, please bring them to the food donation point outside the school reception. The items of food that we need on a regular basis are: cereals, UHT semi-skimmed milk, pasta, rice, pasta sauce, tuna, tinned pies, tinned tomatoes, tinned fruit, tea bags, coffee, squash and baked beans.

### Reading:


