# PE and Sports Premium Funding at Georgian Gardens School 2023/24

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sports Coach has worked alongside teachers supporting them with subject knowledge and demonstrating how to effectively use scheme that has been implemented to teach PE.</li> <li>Equipment for lunch time has been allocated to each year group along with games and activities children can access in order to keep them active during lunch times.</li> <li>Sports Coach has worked with children during lunch time to promote keeping active using skills practice and small games. Having adult support enticed children that may not usually choose to play sport during lunch.</li> <li>Sports Coach to work with selected children (promoting team work, improving skills and a more active lifestyle) in a small group.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Continue monitoring children that are PP and less active and ensuring they have opportunities to attend clubs and events throughout the year.</li> <li>Promote major sporting events throughout the whole school to ensure a high profile of sport- ensure promotion on school's social media and website etc.</li> <li>Ensure children are given opportunities to attend and participate in events and competitions once</li> </ul>
