## Stay Safe with Molly

 Stay calm and quiet around Molly.

- Ask the adult before trying to stroke her.
- An adult must be with you and Molly at all times.



- Molly must always wear her harness.
- Molly must be on her lead if going for a walk.
- If you are holding Molly's lead:



 Hold the handle – do not wrap the lead around your hand.

- If she pulls, stand still and say,
  "Wait!"
- If Molly pulls too hard, drop the lead.
- If she play fights with the lead, drop it.
- If Molly tries to lick or 'mouth' you, say, "No!"
  - Mouthing is where she tries to get you to play by nibbling at your hand or sleeve. This is normal puppy behaviour and is very gentle, but we need to stop it!



- If Molly tries to jump up at you:
  - $\odot$  Step back and turn sideways.
  - Say, "No!"
  - $\circ$  Ignore her until she calms down.
- If Molly shows you she is scared (tail between legs) then give her some space.





- Always wash or sanitise your hands after stroking Molly.
- All animals need to wee and poo, including Molly, sometimes she will be sick too!
  - We are teaching her to go near the.....Space to be agreed.
  - If she does go in the wrong place, don't worry if it is a wee, tell an adult to pick up any poo!





 If you know you are allergic to dogs or if you start itching after stroking Molly, tell an adult in school.



• If you are nervous around dogs, or would just rather not meet her, please tell the member of staff with Molly if you come across her in school.

- Enjoy your time with her!
- If you are lucky, you may be asked to throw a ball for her on the school field. She is fast, so watch out for other people!
