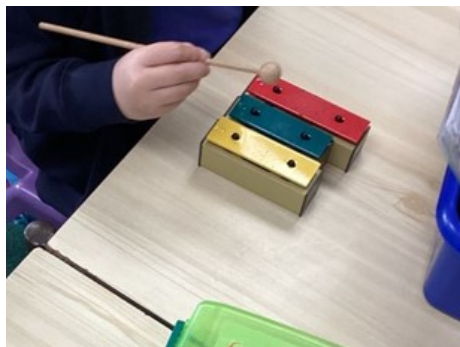

Key Stage 1 Angmering Mile:

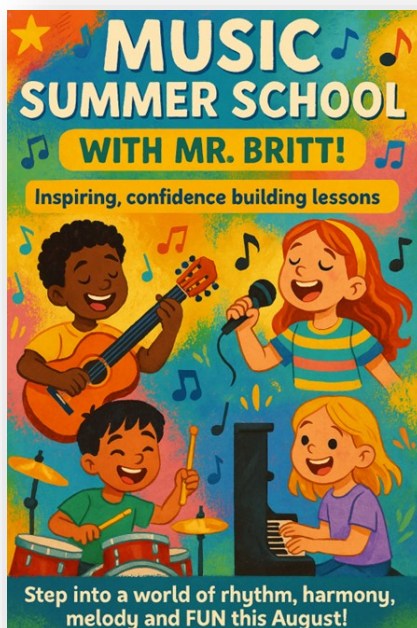
Tuesday afternoon marked the final KS1 Angmering Half Mile, and what a fantastic event it was! We had an excellent turn out, with more children participating from our school than any other. The enthusiasm from all the children was truly heart-warming, and it was a joy to see them take part with such energy and excitement.

We also celebrated some outstanding individual achievements. A huge congratulations to Max, who came first overall - an incredible accomplishment! And well done to Liala, who came third among all the girls. Such brilliant results, and a testament to the effort and spirit shown by all who took part. It was a personal favourite of mine - well done to everyone involved!

Thursday saw our Year 5/6 team compete in a handball tournament alongside three other schools. We got off to a flying start with a 5 - 2 win against St Wilfrid's. The children played brilliantly as a team, showing thoughtful, strategic play that was a pleasure to watch. Next up was St John's, and again, the children stepped up, It took a little while to break the deadlock, and St John's came close with a stop that hit the crossbar, but we secured a strong 3 - 0 victory. The improvement in our team cohesion and confidence throughout the afternoon was fantastic. Our final match was against St Margaret's who had also won both of their previous games. It felt like a final, and what a match it was! We started steadily, with some brilliant interceptions and top-quality saves - particularly Jasper. | | Until... |

| Chickenpox | at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over |
| Diarrhoea and Vomiting | 48 hours after their last episode |
| Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19) | they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19. |
| Impetigo | their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics |
| Measles | 4 days after the rash first appeared |
| Mumps | 5 days after the swelling started |
| Scabies | they've had their first treatment |
| Scarlet Fever | 24 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
| Whooping Cough | 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
