We are a no-nut school. There are children in school with a very serious nut allergy so please avoid sending any food containing nuts (including Nutella). Thank you.





Snapshot of the week:

Year five researched, designed, created and lit set designs relating to Greek myths.



Year One worked with a partner to find missing numbers in number problems. We used number lines and manipulatives to find the answers!

Why - to raise awareness of looking after our planet.


When/where - due: Friday 28th March and delivered to 4TF (named and class) on this day.

What - create 'something' relating to saving our planet and eggs. (poster, 3D model, mobile....)

**How** – include mainly recycled products to create your idea. Themes you could use: eating greener, saving water, saving power, recycling, reusing, reducing, climate change, plastic usage, transport...









### Year 4 Mummification:

The children were involved in the ancient Egyptian mummification process. This hands on experience had the children removing vital organs to be placed into canopic jars ready for the afterlife, removing the brains through the nose, placing treasures into the coffin and finally helping to decorate the sarcophagus for its final journey. Did you know: The word mummification comes from the word 'Mummia' - a tar like paste which wrapped the layers of linen together. Natron is a natural salt used in the drying out process. It took around 70 days to complete the embalming process of the wealthy Egyptians!
